# Explore Puget Sound in a whole new way!

### Iron Goat Trail

**Scenic Trailhead, Leavenworth, WA 98826** Take US 2 to MP 58.3. Turn north onto the Old Cascade Highway, then turn immediately right into the Iron Goat Interpretive Site.

This is a gentle walk along the old Great Northern railroad grade built over the Cascades in 1893. At the time it was built, it was considered the best engineered of the transcontinental railroads. Your journey will take you on one of the intricate switchbacks that once started trains up the Cascades Mountains.

### Heather Meadows

**Deming WA, 98244.** From northern Bellingham off of Interstate 5, drive east 56 miles on the Mount Baker Highway (State Route 542).

Glistening lakes nestle between knolls. Ridges bristle with 900-year-old mountain hemlock. Even the rocks catch the eye. Lava flows from Mount Baker have resisted glacial carving and columns of andesite stand like black anvils against the sky. This awe inspiring location provides a great opportunity for all ages to enjoy.

When preparing for any outdoor adventure, it's the Forest Service's goal to make sure you are sufficiently prepared. While shopping, or visiting with our rangers to plan your next adventure, see if you can't complete all of your challenges. A prize may be waiting for you at the Ranger Desk!

### Big Four Ice Caves

**Granite Falls, WA 98252.** From the Verlot Public Service Center (11 miles east of Granite Falls, WA), head east on the Mt. Loop Highway 14.5 miles to the Big Four Picnic Area. There is a paved parking lot with plenty of parking, vault toilets and a self-serve pay station for a one day Northwest Forest Pass, which is required for the trail.

As you work your way to the next challenge site, take notice of the large mountain hemlock trees and keep an eye out for beavers, birds, salamanders, and other wildlife. Soon you will find yourself at the end of the trail and standing at the base of an impressive 6,153-foot mountain.

### Pier 57 Miner's Landing

**1301 Alaskan Way, Seattle, WA 98101**

Discover the hidden treasures inside Miners Landing on Pier 57 and all the fun activities it has to offer. Learn the history of Miners Landing and why it is important to Seattle.

### Tacoma Nature Center

**Savor the Summer Mission (July 1 - August 31)** - Explore the wetland habitat while learning more about the wildlife and plants that live here. You will likely spot turtles sunning themselves on a log while dragonflies, frogs and swallows work to catch their next meal of bugs.

**Fly into Fall Mission (September - November 30)** - Learn more about birds and the ways animals get around in their habitat as you follow the trail around the lake and look for birds and other wildlife.

### Swan Creek

**1801 East 56th street, Tacoma, WA 98404**

A Walk in the Woods (July 1- Dec. 31) Enjoy a one-mile stroll through a native Douglas-fir upland forest habitat and learn about the interesting plants and animals that call Swan Creek Park home.

**Prize Pick-up Location:** Eastside Community Center 1721 east 56th street, Tacoma WA 98404

### Titlow Park

**8425 6th avenue, Tacoma, WA 98406**

Titlow Loop (July 1-Dec.31) Hike along the lagoons, onto the nature trails and return on the beach promenade to discover the birds, fish, and many forest creatures found in these habitats.

**Prize Pick-up Location:** Metro Parks Tacoma Main Office front desk located at 4702 south 19th street

### Mt. Walker Viewpoint and Smokey Bear

**Mt. Walker Viewpoint** is located at the top of the Mt. Walker Road off Highway 101 just south of Quilcene, Washington. Mt. Walker Road is Forest Road 2730.

Learn about Smokey Bear and fire prevention at this old fire lookout. Enjoy a short hike, views of the Olympic Mountains and the Seattle skyline.

**Prize Pick-up Location:** Quilcene Ranger Station



### Olympic Discovery Trail

**This mission starts at Camp Creek Trailhead just off of Highway 101 on Cooper Ranch Road**

Learn about the historic Spruce Production Railroad and the plants and animals of the Olympic National Forest.

**Prize Pick-up Location:** Quinault Ranger Station or Quilcene Ranger Station



### Rainforest Exploration

**This mission starts at the Rainforest Trailhead about 0.5 miles from the Quinault Ranger Station.**

The Quinault Rainforest is filled with lots of unique and specialized plants and animals. Big trees, cool plants, lots of moss, and slugs!

**Prize Pick-up Location:** Quinault Ranger Station



### Do you want to be a Forest Ranger?

**Interorrem Cabin** is located with the Ranger Hole Trailhead just south of Brinnon, Washington in the Duckabush Recreation Area. Turn off Highway 101 onto Duckabush Road and drive about 4 miles to the trailhead. Be sure to follow all of the rules for the site.

Learn what it was like to be a Forest Ranger in the early 1900s and how you can be a Forest Ranger today!
